

He said that he had suffered a number of lacerations including to his face, back of head, both thighs and also to his fingers.


He said that although his wounds had healed within about six weeks he said that the assault was on his mind quite a lot and he believed that he couldn't 'get over it' emotionally, because people asked him about his scars which would remind him of the event. He said it would have been easier for him to accept his injuries had it been a contest between 'two soldiers in the field'. He said he had had something of a reputation of being a strong person, but this reputation had been 'canned' after the two assaults. He said he felt a lesser person and as if he was 'damaged goods'. He said his self confidence and self esteem had diminished and he was very conscious about his scarring. He said he therefore modified the clothes he wore particularly so as to hide the lacerations on his thighs. He also wore a 'beanie' over his head. He said there were days when he felt lethargic, worthless, depressed, lacking motivation and drive and had lost interest in his gym training. The Claimant said that he had flashbacks of being held down.

He said that he occasionally had nightmares, when he might wake up thinking that he was being shot at, as he had been in 1992. He said that he also had nightmares of the events surrounding the siege of 2012 and this was the one which he most frequently recalled. He said he used to have nightmares about the incident of 2006 and might still think of it, but tried to dismiss these thoughts. He said he had very little recall of the assault of 2007.

The Claimant said that at times he relived the incident on 31 May 2006 including 'the whole episode'. He said this might occur perhaps once every six weeks. He said that

it might occur if he was reminded of the assailants involved or when he looked at his scars. He said that seeing the scars each day 'does my head in' and hence he did not use a mirror when he shaved.

Based on the history provided by the Claimant, the referral documentation provided and the Panel's findings on examination, the Panel concluded that the Claimant is suffering from a Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, relevant in part to the incident of 31 May 2006 and the assault of 21 July 2007, and also an Antisocial Personality Disorder, unrelated to the incident of 31 May 2006 or the assault of 21 July 2007. The Panel considers that the psychiatric condition has stabilised.

He had access to a computer although without connection to the Internet. He told me that he spent time preparing his case and did not bother with games or other such pursuits. At times he said he would lie down and collect his thoughts. However, he stated that generally his concentration was reduced, his motivation minimal and although he enjoyed preparing documents related to his court case, he found this at times stressful and confronting.

"He needs to deal with these emotions" "hence giving in his T.V. to staff". Psych services engage in constant consultation with prisoner".

Local Plan Files Notes- Location entry dated 28/ 1/ 2013.

"Chris is still showing signs of stress"

Refer to Geo Care Medical report, entry dated 28/01/2013, Psychiatric Nurse. Whilst on Unit this Am. Staff notified self-prisoner had handed in T.V. as "was sick" of watching so many people die in Syria" Nil risk identified. <sup>18</sup>.

## DANNY SULLIVAN WOULD GO ON TO CLAIM THE FOLLOWING LIES:

X [27] He reported that in the past he had banged his head repeatedly to be moved out of an observation cell. He reported self-harm including swallowing tin lids and fan pieces, razor blades, ring pulls and plastic knives rolled up in clingfilm. He said of this, "I didn't give a fuck... happened in the last couple of years" and stated that this was because he found being placed in management cells intolerable. He denied having self-harmed outside of prison and denied any period of significant suicidal ideation.
