[42] "Previous assaults by Police". [50] Later in 2012 he returned to Barwon Prison and was reviewed by a psychiatrist, who in September 2012 noted features of depression and anxiety. Medication was offered bur declined by Mr Binse. In late November 2012 he reported some symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder and the visiting psychiatrist noted this diagnosis.[66] "Persistent fears that he could be harmed" [67], "He reports past traumas involving believing that he was to be killed by Police or others" [68], "He reports that various otherwise innocuous events trigger emotional responses including anxiety or distress, that he is preoccupied with threat to him or those close to him, and that he has repeated recollections of traumatic events that have happened to him. He has had periods of marked emotional volatility which may reflect periods in which his coping strategies are ineffective".<sup>70</sup>.

He currently presents as ruminatively fixated on the attack upon him in May 2006 by one or two prison inmates, with this fixation extending beyond the details of the attack to include safety concerns in the community and the prison environment. A concern at a level which impacts upon his sleep and day to day functioning be he in the community or the prison environment. His presentation is consistent with symptoms of Post traumatic Stress Disorder and while it is unclear if he would meet the full diagnostic criteria; in the writer's view he would meet most. When in the community his fears have been exacerbated by his drug use, and perhaps the narcissistic features of his personality but also have had a credible connection to 'Gangland' events of the time and fears for his safety, particularly given the attack in May 2006. Hence in the writer's opinion there is a clear linear psychological connection between the events of May 2006 in which Mr Binse was severely injured while in custody, and his behaviour when released on Parole including his offending during this period which involved: drug use, possession of false identification, possession of weapons and a breach of parole.
